

Hotels Selected for 45th Reunion

Reunion Chair Jim Lustenader has been working hard to secure hotel space for our 45th reunion, October 14-17, 2011. To fully enjoy the fall scenery, Jim has chosen Dowd's Country Inn in Lyme, about fifteen minutes north of Hanover. Room rates, which include breakfast, will range from about \$130 to about \$165 per night, depending upon type of accommodation. The Inn will likely be the site of one of our planned dinners. Reservations can be made by calling 1-800-482-4712. Be sure to mention "Class of 1966 Reunion". Space is limited so feel free to make reservations now. A deposit is required.



Within Hanover itself, Jim will be securing a block of rooms at the Hanover Inn. The exact number and rate has not yet been provided, as the Inn only takes reservations sixteen months in advance, but you can figure about \$200 per night.

To the south of Hanover, about ten minutes from campus, a block has been secured at the Courtyard by Marriott Inn in Lebanon--it's located across Rte. 120 from DHMC, next to the Centerra office and retail complex. They will make promotional rates available to us of \$169 w/o breakfast and \$189 with breakfast--both with a two-night minimum stay. This puts them above Dowd's but still in the mid-range between Hanover Inn at the top and the Norwich Inn and Hampton Inn (WRJ) at the bottom. The rates will be good until 60 days prior to our event; classmates will be able to make reservations about 12 months ahead of the weekend.

Finally, blocks have been secured across the river at the Norwich Inn and at the Hampton Inn in White River Junction. Rates for both will be set in October 2010; our discount will be 15% off regular rates at the Hampton, probably in the range of \$95-\$115. By the way, Jim has secured a perpetual 15% discount at any Hampton Inn in the country for all '66ers. Use the Discount Request Code #000263323.

Golf Mini-Reunion in Naples, FL

Had enough of cold and snow? Would you like to take a spring break in "paradise", aka Naples, Florida, and work on your golf game? From April 16 to 19, 2010, the Class of '66 will be having a golf weekend at two of the top courses in Naples, on the warm and inviting Gulf of Mexico. There will be activities for non-golfers (e.g., tennis, shopping, beaching), but for the hard core duffers among you the highlight will be a chance to play the Bonita Bay and Naples Grande courses, among the best facilities in the South.

The fine points of the weekend are being worked out, but here are the key activities and dates:

April 16: Arrive in Ft. Myers (airport code RSW) and transfer to hotel in Naples (about 45 minutes from the airport); dinner on your own at select restaurants



April 17: Morning round at Naples Grande, followed by lunch; afternoon play may also be available (plus activities all day for non-golfers); cocktail reception and group dinner

April 18: Morning round at Bonita Bay followed by lunch; afternoon play may also be available (plus activities for non-golfers); group dinner and awards

April 19: Group breakfast; depart from Ft. Myers

Greens fees (including cart fee) are \$92 per person at Bonita and \$85 per person at Naples Grande. The Trianon Hotel in downtown (about 13 miles from either course and walkable to shopping and beach) will be our headquarters hotel. The rooms will be \$170 per night (including continental breakfast), and the hotel will hold 10-15 rooms for us until March 1. You will book your own reservations with the hotel; cancellations prior to March 1 will not incur a fee, but cancellations beyond that date will pay the full amount for 3 nights.



Arrangements have also been made with the Naples Marriott at the rate of \$89 without breakfast or \$99 with. This hotel is not near downtown Naples and will therefore require a car for those non-golfers who want to go into town during the day. Once a headcount of attendees is determined, car pooling arrangements can be developed.

Meals and beverages will be the responsibility of each attendee (i.e., we are not making a pre-paid, packaged banquet arrangement for this event); prices at the better spots in Naples are about the same as in any major metro area.



Class of 1966 Places First in Class Metrics

For the first time, Alumni Relations has developed metrics to judge how the various alumni classes stack up. The primary focus is to highlight those classes that could benefit from mentoring by "successful" classes. Various categories (e.g. financial reporting, dues participation, DCF participation, website updates, number of newsletters, number of class projects, mini-reunion attendance) are quantified and areas of weakness are highlighted in yellow (warning), orange (danger zone), and red (failing)...kind of like airport security or smog danger!! At any rate, the Class of 1966 was one of only six classes without any yellows, oranges, or reds (the others were 1960, 1979, 1981, 1982, and 1989) and tied with the Class of 1979 for the highest point totals among those six classes. Dartmouth Alumni Council Meeting

Most of you will have received by email **Wayne LoCurto's** thorough report on the Alumni Council meeting of December 3-5. For those who would like to refer to the minutes, you can access them at www.alumni.dartmouth.edu (Alumni Relations Home Page).

One of the more important roles of the Council is to select nominees for the position of Alumni Trustee. Here is Wayne's report on the coming election March 10-April 7:

“On Friday December 4th, the Alumni Council voted 89-1 to approve candidates to run for the two Board of Trustee vacancies that will be voted upon next spring: Mort Kondracke '60, Executive Editor of Roll Call (www.mort4dartmouth.com and <http://alumni.dartmouth.edu/default.aspx?id=437>) and John Replogle '88, President and CEO of Burt's Bees (www.john4dartmouth.com and <http://alumni.dartmouth.edu/default.aspx?id=437>). Mort and John are highly accomplished in their respective fields, critical and independent thinkers, and effective communicators. Both have multi-generational Dartmouth ties, a history of involvement with the college, and board experience.

Each candidate addressed the Council and gave a brief statement. I had the opportunity to talk with each candidate at a reception. Both are impressive candidates who love Dartmouth and want to serve the College. Both were vetted by the nominating committee over an extended period. Both candidates said they were open to evaluating parity once they were on the Board. I urge you to learn about each candidate during the campaigns leading up to the spring election.

There may be petition candidates running against them. Petition candidates have until early February to enter the campaign. At this point, no one has indicated that they intend to run. The critical thing is that we vote. The voting record of alumni has been poor to date. If we want to be involved in the governance of Dartmouth, we must vote.”


