70th Birthday Party Big Success

Eighty-eight folks -- including 44 classmates and 44 significant others, children, and grandchildren (see list of participants on Page 3) -- gathered in Jackson Hole, Wyoming for the celebration of our 70th birthdays.

Festivities kicked off on July 11, with an opening reception at the Antler Inn, headquarters for the mini-reunion. Some, including John and Cynthia Pearson, arrived earlier in the week to visit other local sites including Yellowstone National Park. Others, including Pat Norton and Gina Higgins, arrived later that evening and missed the three optional post-reception activities:

- A visit to the Bar J Chuck Wagon Western Show and Dinner (where our group of 20 were among 750 people served a "cowboy" dinner and entertained by the "Wranglers"),
- The Grand Teton Music Festival performance of classical music (23 attendees), and
- The Jackson Rodeo, with 32 aficionados.

Saturday morning activities started with:

- Golf at the Teton Pines Country Club, with various "meese" playing through,
- White water rafting down the Snake River, 20 miles south of Jackson (see p. 9), and
- Horseback riding for our group of 21 along a ridge with views of the Tetons on one side and the town of Jackson and the National Elk Refuge below on the other side.
- Many spent the morning in-town, visiting the weekly Farmers Market and an art exhibition in one of the town parks.



The highlight of the afternoon was a visit to the National Wildlife Museum of Art, where five docents, including our own Caroline Taylor, exposed us to works by Charles Russell, George Caitlin, J.J. Audubon, and Albert Bierstadt.

Saturday evening brought everyone together for a wine and beer reception and barbeque dinner at the beautiful home of Ken and Caroline Taylor in Wilson, a short ride from Jackson on the Fish Creek. Outstanding views of the Teton Range from the back deck added to the beauty of the setting. The cool night was made comfortable by vests with the 70th Birthday Party logo procured by Carol and Dean Spatz. Our special thanks to the Taylors for their hospitality and for organizing a memorable evening.

Sunday morning included another optional white water rafting trip down the Snake; a total of 29 folks participated over the two days.

Afternoon activities took place in the Grand Teton National Park, commencing with a picnic at the Craig Thomas Discovery Center, including a talk by a Park Ranger on the establishment of the National Park. About half the group left for a ten-mile float ride down the Snake River, encountering wild life and gorgeous views of the Teton Range. Most of the other half proceeded to Jenny Lake, for boat rides across the lake and hikes back to the visitor center. A smaller group went to Leigh Lake for a more arduous hike led by Jeff Gilbert.

ALUMNI FUND NEWS

The final numbers are finally in.

Our class raised \$236,096 for the DCF this past fiscal year, compared to a targeted goal of \$250,000, with a participation rate of 46.6%, compared to a goal of 55%.

I wish to thank our agents and all those who contributed to our class effort, and those who contacted me with suggestions and concerns. We have yet to set our goals for 2015. Our focus will soon center on our 50th reunion giving. We will be actively soliciting affinity agents and developing ideas on how to make our historically solid contributions to the DCF even more meaningful in 2016.

CLASS TREASURER'S REPORT

At least one classmate asked why we were asking for dues again, so I am reminded that from time to time, we need to reiterate that for financial reporting and accounting, all alumni classes work on a fiscal year that begins on July 1st rather than a calendar year. We are now in dues year 2014-15, and if you are not sure if you have paid, we keep a list of all current year dues payer on the class web site, www.dartmouth66.org, in the "dues" section.

What is different this dues year is that we are using email and the newsletter to solicit dues, and minimizing the use of mailed dues notices. If successful, we can save nearly \$1,000 by eliminating or reducing costs for printing, postage, and labor associated with mailed notices.

Dues remain \$66, but we ask that you consider a voluntary contribution of \$34 to make the payment a nice even \$100. (Did I mention that nearly 90% of you do just that!)

That extra \$34 is used for special projects such as the Connections Program, and our 50th reunion yearbook that will be sent to all classmates who have paid their dues for the three years culminating with our reunion.

Here's how to pay:

1. **Easiest way:** Use PayPal. With PayPal, you pay by credit card, but you need not share the account information with me. Go to the class website, www.dartmouth66.org, and in the left margin, click on the "Dues" button, and you will see the simple instructions for paying through PayPal (and you need not have a PayPal account to do this).






